Methodist founder John Wesley called for commitment on the part of his followers. Centuries later, Janine Farquhar abides by the request. How else can

one account for

Janine's consistent dedication to Fullerton First United Methodist Church by teaching Sunday School for 15 years, singing in the choir for 35 years and making sure another generation of Farquhar kin is introduced to the benefits of leading a Christian life?

Oh, grandchildren Beau, 4 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>, and Daxton, 3 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>, may be a bit young to capture the concepts of Christianity, but Janine is making sure the boys are on the path by their attendance at Sunday School on a regular basis just as she stayed in her formative years. Older grandson Noah, 13, periodically serves as an acolyte, and participates in the youth activities.

Looking back on her own childhood, Janine remembers meeting for Sunday school classes in the north building that is currently rented to other congregations. "We had little cubicles for different grade levels," she says. "And for me, the real treat was listening to storytelling. We didn't have TVs or videos. We had flannel storyboards. There was a sense of wonder as you waited to hear what happened to the characters."

Janine traces her own storytelling talents to the FUMC congregants Carolyn Johnson, who was the city's children's library director, and author Dora May Sim, who penned the Fullerton history book, "Ostrich Eggs for Breakfast."

And what is her favorite Bible story?

"The Book of Esther," she answers promptly. "You know, it's about girl power." She also enjoyed reading "Bad Girls of the Bible" and "Really Bad Girls of the Bible" by author Liz Curtis Higgs. asking youths to bring personal items in a backpack as our current Pastor Phil does, Wickett would each week bring his own item of choice in a paper bag. He also introduced gullying prayers, because they were so deep, Janine says. "But he called them Barranca Prayers, probably referring to Fullerton's barrancas."

There was a 10-year period when Janine "took a vacation" from church, exploring other denominations and "to be honest, just enjoying sleeping in on Sunday mornings."

And no wonder. Her high school studies kept her busy. She took three years of Russian language with FUMC member and high school instructor Larry Meyers, participated in the Girls Athletic Association where she earned her four-year sports letter and graduated with honors from Fullerton High.

Following two years at Fullerton College, she enrolled at Cal State Fullerton where, as a single mother, she graduated with a dual degree in Public Administration/Political Science.

She was ultimately hired as an assistant librarian at Anaheim Public Library, and then served as an Anaheim police officer for three years. In the fall of 1987, FUMC Pastor Charles Dennis hired Janine as the church young adult director. One year later, she resigned to work for the State of California Compensation Insurance Fund, a job she held for 25 years until retiring in 2013.

It wasn't until recently that Janine left her hometown to move in with her mother, Juel, in Yorba Linda. After all, Janine was born across the street from the Fullerton Methodist Church 68 years ago, and spent nearly her entire life within a few miles of the downtown building.

Juel Peters arrived from southern Illinois in 1939. "Mom went on to earn a teaching degree," Janine says. "She and my father, Ozel, a postman, raised three children, first in a two-story Victorian house on Truslow Avenue, and then on Rosslyn Avenue.

"I know my mother was my inspiration for loving children, and helping the younger generation," Janine

She recalls junior high Sunday school teacher Dr. Wickett, who initiated brown paper sack talks. Instead of says. "And all my family has been an inspiration for my love of music."

As a loyal member of the FFUMC choir, Janine toured Austria, Germany and England in 1995 and, in 1999, the choir under the direction of John Lamkin and Sean Bolware visited England and Scotland. She also performed with the choir twice at Carnegie Hall.

What life lesson has she learned from all her experiences?

"Do good no matter what," she says. "I believe in universal truths. We don't only have one book on how to live. But our life lesson will filter down to places we will never know."

Pondering how parishioners can make their church stronger, Janine believes success is in tandem with involvement.

"It's really not the size of the congregation, but what they do with what they've got," she adds. "We want to grow, but at the same time, we have to have depth."

## **Response Magazine**


